MINISTER'S REPORT: This minister's report covers things accomplished in the month of December. I made six visits with Pete & Kathy Gray, Murlene Williams, Vance & Deloris Meads and Vivian Ashe.

For two weeks in December (12/6-12/16), I supervised a completion of a daily productivity log for Devin, our church secretary. The log was helpful in knowing what tasks he's completing and how much time it takes to do such tasks. This week is his last week of his second 60-day probationary period; however, we will be discussing ways to maximize his efficiency. The Stewardship Committee will meet soon to decide whether to make Devin's position permanent or not.

Within our Prayer Gatherings, we have completed three chapters of our new book "How to Pray." I have also added our prayer list to our website. Our Bible Discussion group is currently reading through 1 Chronicles, 2 Samuel and the book of Psalms.

In the month of December, we had multiple visitors but only one connect card submitted. We had 50 in attendance for our Christmas Party, 19 people participated in our Christmas Caroling ride through our neighborhood and we had 32 in attendance on Christmas Eve.

I was not scheduled for this month's meeting for the NC Commission on Ministry; however, my next meeting with the commission is scheduled for January 10 where I will be presenting my final paper for review. An ordination service in March is still probable.

In regards to the goals I set last month, I have been assisting the Stewardship Committee in monitoring Devin's performance, use of time and assisting him with feedback (and will for another week) and time-saving strategies. I have also touched based with the Outreach, Education and Membership committees about scheduling regular meetings for 2023. Dates have not been set but I am confident that each committee has a leader that will effectively gather their teams in regular meetings.

Here are my goals for January: 1) To assist the Stewardship Committee in deciding whether to make Devin's position permanent or not, 2) instigate meetings with the three committees mentioned above and 3) to complete the final steps with the COM before ordination.

As always I'm open to all feedback and am appreciative of your service to First Christian Church!

There being no further business, June Gibbs made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Portia Copeland. Our pastor dismissed us in prayer.

Super Bowl Party!




