The official board of First Christian Church met in the Fellowship Classroom on March 6, 2023 at 7:00 P.M. Teresa Moore, moderator, called the meeting to order and opened with prayer. Our pastor and 15 board members were present. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Portia Copeland provided the February check register as well as account balances as of February 28, 2023.

WORSHIP COMMITTEE: The Worship Committee met on Sunday, March 5, 2023. We opened the meeting by sharing positive worship-related things we have noticed or recognized since our last meeting. We then discussed many upcoming important dates and events within our duties and responsibilities. Those events are:

EDUCATION COMMITTEE: Jessica presented several needs of Children's Church including volunteers to serve on a Children's Ministry Team. Among the weekly needs she listed: donations of snacks; possible use of van to pick up children for church; check in/ check out "safe kid" check at all functions including our children; more promotions of activities on social media; information packets for parents; possible splitting of age groups; and many other ideas for increasing interest and attendance in our ministry for children. Plans are underway for an Unforgettable Easter Egg Hunt which will provide fun but, also, help children and families discover the message and hope of Easter.

Subsequently, one of our top two applicants withdrew from consideration leaving us with one remaining to interview. Fortunately, the one remaining was everyone's top choice. At the second meeting, we interviewed Mrs. Rana White who had much of the job experience we were looking for. We decided to move forward with her application. We contacted three of her references and all of them praised her job performance. All stated that she was trustworthy, dependable, knowledgeable of computers, worked well with others, and a hard worker. Collectively, the committee decided to bring Mrs. White's application to the board for approval to extend a job offer to her.




