Thankfully God gives us that season every year and the Lord's table every Sunday to reflect on His unfailing, unconditional love. APRIL, 2023 BOARD REPORT

TREASURER'S REPORT: Portia Copeland provided the March check register as well as account balances as of March 31, 2023.

- Speakers have been secured for the 23rd and 30th of April to recognize Child Abuse Prevention Month and Second Chance Month.

Thanks to Tammy Sawyer for conducting the March meeting in my absence. Our next meeting will be on Betty Sawyer, Worship Chairperson April 23rd.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE: In the absence of Jessica James, Norma James provided a reminder of the Spring Fling to be held on April 16th, following worship. Plans include a petting zoo, a food truck, and an Easter egg hunt. Norma also encouraged Sunday School attendance which meets in the Fellowship Classroom each Sunday at 10:10 A.M.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE: Garage and Breakfast Sale was held on March 24th and 25th. Following are the results:

For example, a person whose car breaks down can receive help with repairs to keep them working and providing for their family.
