TREASURER'S REPORT: Portia Copeland provided the November check register as well as account balances. She reported that things are going well.

WORSHIP COMMITTEE: We began the new liturgical year with the decorating of the sanctuary on Friday, Dec. 1, with much participation. The pastor incorporated the hanging of the greens in the December 3rd service. MINISTER'S REPORT: This report covers things accomplished in the month of November. I made 11 pastoral visits this past month with a goal of 15 for December.

Open Gym had an average of 13 teens in attendance each Monday night. The gym will be closed for the month of December and will reopen on Monday, Jan. 22. The same group that watched The Chosen got together on the 14th to watch "The Sound of Freedom" with 11 in attendance. Our Bible Discussion group is reading through the books of 2 Kings, 2 Chronicles, Isaiah and Hosea with an average of six in attendance.

I cooked pancakes alongside Joe Lassiter for the Pancake/Sausage breakfast and attended the monthly CMF meeting. I officiated two funerals this month; one for my uncle and the other for Cynda Bunch.

On Wednesday, the 28th our church secured two sizable donations for two different purposes. Rev. Daniel Spence (Pastor at Victory Praise & Worship Center) and I will be taking 13 of our Open Gym teenagers to an NBA game in Washington, DC on Martin Luther King, Jr. Day on January 15th. We will be using the church's van for this one day trip. We had an anonymous donor outside the church give \$900 to cover the cost of all the tickets while the church will cover the cost of gas and parking from a previous donation made to Open Gym. Rev. Daniel Spence will personally be covering the cost of lunch for the teens while I will cover the cost of their dinner, making this trip completely free for any that sign up and turn in the liability form.

Our church secured a sizeable donation from Guy C. Long, Inc. from Chester, PA of 120 NIV Large Print Pew Bibles as well as \$2000 to go to upgrading our basketball goals in the gym.

We received two anonymous donations within the church in order to pay for the software called Power-Church, which Rana will use to gather, store and update member information. She has downloaded the software and will soon begin the long, detailed process of putting all of our church's info into this program.

The Outreach Committee and I plan to go Christmas Caroling on the week before Christmas. Details will be announced. We'll have another community cleanup day here at the church in partnership with Green Saves Green on Saturday, Jan. 13th at 2pm. I hope that many will participate in either of these outreaches.

In December I will be mapping out next year's calendar of events, fundraisers and outreaches as well as making a gameplan on revisiting our Vision & Mission Statements along with reinstituting cabinet meetings for 2024 in order to assure that each committee has what it needs to meet regularly and function accordingly.

God has surely blessed us in 2023 and I'm looking forward to a year of growth in 2024 with a couple new leaders on committees!
