## JUNE, 2023 BOARD REPORT

The official board of First Christian Church met in the Fellowship Classroom on June 5, 2023, at 7:00 P.M. Teresa Moore, moderator, called the meeting to order and opened with prayer. Our pastor and 17 board members were present. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

**TREASURER' REPORT:** Portia Copeland provided the May check register as well as account balances as of May 23, 2023. The treasurer answered questions about the copier service and the video license for our church to show movies. Both amounts cover service for the entire year.

**WORSHIP COMMITTEE:** The Worship Committee met in the Fellowship Hall on June 4th with 12 members present. The following were points on the agenda:

We have been working on a reorganization of the order of service to ensure smooth transition from morning greetings into the body of worship. The board was given copies of proposed changes to put in place July 2<sup>nd</sup>.

We discussed the results from the poll of the congregation about a possible time change for worship on Sundays. It was decided that the difference in the yes/no votes was not significant enough to act upon.

We made Father's Day plans and will help instruct our youth on the distribution of the aifts.

While the nursery is not within our responsibilities, we discussed that in many churches children of a certain age begin to remain in the worship service. This idea might not be the best solution for FCC as there is a need for our older children to bond and learn as a group and start forming groups such as Chi Rho (middle school) and CYF (high school).

We discussed the need in the near future to divide Children's Church into two groups as the age ranges currently are quite wide. Rev. T.J. is working with the Education Committee and our committee will support their efforts in any way we can.

The next meeting is scheduled for September 10th unless there is a specific need to arise.


